
Travel

We advise you to not use the above postcode in your Sat Nav to find the venue, as it takes you to an industrial estate nearby.

From Junction 31 of M1, take A57 towards Sheffield. At the roundabout take A618 towards Mansfield, Wales Bar and Clowne. At the traffic lights go straight on and the park entrance is at the bottom of the hill on the right.

Parking

Parking is available onsite charged at £5.00* per car or motorcycle per day at the gatehouse. Once past the gatehouse please follow the signage to the Water Sports and Activity Centre and the spectator and competitor car park.



*Car parking cost may be subject to change by the park.

The Park

The 750 acre park hosts a number of walking and cycling routes which link into the Transpennine Trail and Sustrans Route 6. Bicycles are available to hire from the Water Sports and Activity Centre. Photographic ID will be required to hire a bicycle.

There are 5 lakes within the park, with the competition being held in the Main Lake which is 1 mile long. The Nature Reserve offers fantastic bird watching with over 260 different varieties of birds recorded over the past two years.

Registration

Upon arrival, please ensure you report to the registration desk between the times listed above for your specific race.

Here you will check in for your race and collect your race pack which will include: Your specific race coloured swimming cap, race numbers and timing chips. You will also be asked to sign a Medical Declaration Form (see page 6) – without this you will not be able to participate in the competition.

It is competitors' responsibility to ensure that all timing chips and wristbands are securely fastened.

Briefing

Briefing will take place in the Lakeside room, located on the other side of the Water Sports and Activity Centre. It is essential that every competitor and their coaches are present at the Briefing as important information will be provided about the race and safety procedures will

be explained. All competitors will be marked in and out of briefings to ensure everyone has received the information.

Competitors and their coaches must attend the briefing specific to their wave, at the time detailed above. Any swimmer who has not attended the briefing will not be able to swim.

Changing

Group changing facilities, toilets and 50p lockers for personal belongings are available at the Water Sports and Activity Centre. Boxes for footwear will be provided before entry on to the pontoon.

Warm up

Warm up will be available to competitors in the warm up pod at the time specified above.

Swimwear

If wetsuits are to be worn, swimming costumes should be worn underneath. Please ensure you read the below Water temperature and Wetsuit information for the competition as this had changed since the 2016 competition.

In Open Water, swimwear for both men and women shall not cover the neck, extend past the shoulder, nor extend below the ankle.

OWS 6.9 No swimmer shall be permitted to use or wear any device which may be an aid to their speed, endurance or buoyancy. Goggles, a maximum of two (2) caps, nose clip and earplugs may be used.

OWS 6.10 Swimmers shall be allowed to use grease or other such substances providing these are not, in the opinion of the Referee, excessive.

Swimwear should be of a textile material, as pool rules apply. Our guidance is: The material used for swimsuits can be only "textile fabric" defined as material consisting of natural and/or synthetic, individual and non-consolidated yarns used to constitute a fabric by weaving, knitting, and/or braiding.

Water temperature and Wetsuits

In accordance to FINA Technical Rules of Open Water Swimming:

- Water temperature 20 degrees or above: Swimming costumes must be worn and comply with the FINA requirements (FINA rule BL 8.4).
- Water temperature 18-19.9 degrees: Competitors may choose to wear a wetsuit or a swimming costume. Both must comply with FINA requirements (FINA rule BL 8.5).
- Water temperature 16-17.9 degrees: Competitors must wear a FINA approved wetsuit (FINA rule BL 8.5)

Medical


The course will be marshalled by safety boats and first aiders to assist anyone experiencing any issues. An ambulance and first aiders will also be in attendance.

Race course

Access to the swim start will be down a ramp and on to the start pontoon. Prior to accessing the pontoon, for safety reasons, it is your responsibility to ensure that the race numbers provided to you in your race pack are clearly displayed on your hat, shoulders (depending on wetsuit), arms (depending on wetsuit) and back of your hands throughout the race. You will also be checked by the chip timing company.

The event will start with a dive start from the pontoon. Competitors may start in the water if they inform the Referee at the briefing.

The course will be marked with large buoys and will be swum in an anti-clockwise direction. The four turn buoys are large and coloured fluorescent pink, swimmers should always keep these large buoys on the left.

Waves

Races will be conducted in the waves detailed in the event schedule above. Each age group will swim in its own wave. Girls and boys will swim in separate waves.

Race Finish

- On turning the third turn buoy of the final lap, competitors will swim directly towards the finish.
- The finish will be marked by two yellow buoys defining the entrance to a funnel leading up to the finish line. The finish funnel is part of the course and must be entered between the two buoys.
- The finish is "swim through" and competitors MUST reach up and touch the finish banner. This is essential to determine place and to ensure your timing chip is read.

Further details regarding the race procedure will be given at the competitors' briefing.

Timing and Results

The race will be electronically timed by Race Timing Solutions.

It is important that you wear the two wrist chips you have been provided with and that you reach up and touch the finish banner to ensure your timing and place is registered.

Unofficial results will be available to view online and onsite. Confirmed results will be posted on the <u>Swim England National Open Water Festival pages</u>.

Presentations

Medal presentations will take place as soon as possible after results for each race have been confirmed and after everyone in the wave featuring that age group has finished. Competitors who have achieved medal positions should report to the presentation podium as soon as possible dressed in full club tracksuit.

Safety Information

- Safety boats will be on the water and course officials patrolling the edge of the lake. If a competitor gets into difficulties, they should lie on their back in the water with their arm in the air. A rescue boat, equipped with blankets, will come and collect the swimmer. Water marshals, kayaks and land marshals with throw ropes will all be on hand should a swimmer experience any difficulties.
- Competitors are never far from the lake bank and the turn sections of the course are indicated by large fluorescent buoys.
- Please use sun block whatever the weather; always apply after numbering or an hour before numbering to allow time for it to soak in.
- Wear mirrored goggles to prevent glare and wear goggles underneath the swim cap. This will avoid goggles being knocked off the head at the start and around the turn buoys.
- Stay relaxed at the start of the race and don't panic. Cold water can make competitors breathe rapidly. If this happens, try to stay calm and concentrate on breathing deeply until the body adjusts to the water temperature.
- After leaving the water drink flat coke. Coke kills 'most' bacteria and 'bugs' swallowed during open water competition.

ACCREDITATION

Accreditation for both coaches and athletes will not be in force at this year's event.
